

Featuring nine works on paper and nine paintings, Guidi's showing -entitled *Infinite Waves* - takes inspiration from nature and its essential role during the pandemic. 

### Thaddaeus Ropac, Booth F06

Known for exhibiting exceptional artwork, Thaddaeus Ropac's showing *documenta 1982 revisited* - curated by Rudi Fuchs - reflects on masterworks completed around 1982. Almost 40 years on, pieces by artistic giants like Gilbert & George, Georg Baselitz and Robert Mapplethorpe function as time capsules of a bygone era, filled with politics and innuendos that apply just as aptly today as they did in the '80s. Having seen an early preview of Gilbert & George's mammoth painting *STREET MEET*, we can attest to its impact!



### Galerie Chenel, Booth B07

Situated on Quai Voltaire, opposite the Louvre Museum, Galerie Chenel is one of the most - if not the most - prestigious gallery specialising in archaeological objects, with a particular emphasis on Roman arts. Having worked with London's dealer-to-the-stars Oscar Humphries, it's no surprise that Galerie Chenel has sold ancient sculptures to esteemed institutions like the British Museum and the Metropolitan Museum of Art. Dreamy as ever, their showing this year is a must-see filled with museum-calibre antiquities.
